So Many Distractions

While attending a conference on Florida's West Coast recently, I noticed that the announcements on virtually every hotel and restaurant marguis were the same. The hotels did not advertise "vacancy" or "no vacancy." The restaurants did not tout "grilled salmon or broiled grouper specials." They all read: Lights out for turtles.

This is nesting time on the beaches for loggerhead sea turtles. Between May and September the females have used their flippers to excavate a cavity in a dry part of the beach. Once depositing up to 125 eggs each, they cover them with sand and head back out to sea. Sea turtle hatchlings tend to emerge from the nest at night. They orient themselves toward the brightest horizon—usually the moon reflecting on the waves. Lights from nearby buildings, porches and streets can disorient the hatchlings and they may wander inland where they often die of exposure. If they stray away from the water, many hatchlings may be killed by predators like birds and crabs. Hence the plea: Lights out for turtles.

Every species has its distractions. For loggerhead sea turtles it's the wrong kind of light, but for humans, there's a host of forces that compete for our attention. There are persistent voices telling us to shop and there are noisy voices telling us

we don't need God. Envy and jealousy often pull us off course. So does business.

My aim in every program is to help people just like you gain and keep "a center" to life-specifically, a gospel center. That's why I talk with so many guests about what it is that helps them keep their eye on the grace of God.
